

Avon Scholars Program

What is the Avon Scholars Program?

Ivy Tech Community College and the Town of Avon are committed to making education and training affordable for the residents and businesses of Avon. The partnership between Ivy Tech and Avon consists of two scholarship programs: one for residents of Avon and one for businesses located in Avon.

Scholarship Program

Scholarships are available for residents of Avon who are interested in furthering their education at Ivy Tech. The scholarships are limited to tuition and fees up to twelve (12) credit hours and must be renewed each semester.

To be eligible for the scholarship, you must:

1. Must be a current resident of Avon
2. Individuals must be a high school graduate or completed a GED
3. Must be accepted by Ivy Tech as a full or part-time student
4. Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Student Aid and available at www.fafsa.gov)
5. Maintain a cumulative grade point average at Ivy Tech of 2.5 or greater

Training Program

This scholarship is for individuals who are employed at a company located in Avon and who are interested in furthering their education, seeking to upgrade their skills or would like to attain a certification in their field. The training dollars are limited to courses offered through Ivy Tech's Workforce and Economic Development program. Eligible companies and employees may select an open enrollment course (current courses listed at ivytech.edu/Indianapolis/WED) or Ivy Tech can develop and deliver courses on-site.

Training Scholarship Requirements:

1. Sponsored employee(s) or company must be located in Avon (employees are not required to be residents of Avon)
2. Employer must match the awarded scholarship dollar-for-dollar and/or sponsor employee(s)

Avon Campus - Frequently Asked Questions

1. I heard there is a new Community Campus coming soon.

2. What is the address of the new Avon site?

7508 Beechwood Centre Road, Avon, IN 46123-7893 – For a map and directions to the new Avon site, visit google.com/maps and insert the address in the address field.

3. What are the hours of operation at Avon?

We anticipate the hours to be similar to those of our other community campus sites: Monday-Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Friday 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Saturday 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Friday evening hours may be added depending on demand.



4. Will the building be finished in time for the summer semester?

Classes at the new Avon site will begin in the Fall 2010 term. Summer 2010 classes scheduled for Ameriplex will be held at Ameriplex.

5. Can I purchase books at Avon?

Books will not be available at Avon. Students taking classes at Avon should purchase books at the bookstore at the North Meridian Campus, or on-line at ivytech.edu/Indianapolis (click on “bookstore” in the right-hand column).

6. What if I need to see an advisor?

Advisors are available at the North Meridian and Lawrence (Fairbanks) campuses. Office hours for Academic Advising, Admissions, Financial Aid, and Registration and Records at both the North Meridian and the Lawrence Campuses are: Monday through Thursday 9 a.m. – 7 p.m., Friday 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., and Saturday 9 a.m. – Noon.

7. What about parking?

There will be ample parking at the new location. Students, faculty and staff will need to obtain an Ivy Tech parking tag. Parking tags are issued at NMC, Lawrence, Carmel, and Ameriplex (through Summer 2010), and Avon (starting Fall 2010). Parking tags are valid at all Ivy Tech – Central Indiana regional campuses and sites. To obtain a parking tag, proof of fall registration and an ID must be provided. You will also need your student ID number, make and model of the car, and the license plate number of the car.
